

Matching-up Card game

Below are a set of cards that are already matched up. All the question cards are in blue and all the answer cards are in pink/purple. This is a fun game to learn various facts and information about Salat and quiz your friends! It can be played by yourself or with friends and family.

Print the following two pages out and cut out each card using a pair of scissors. There are several ways to play this game. Try and make some own ideas to play this game and send us the instructions at "contact_us@nasirat.org.uk"

1. Put the cards in two piles; questions and answers. The Questions are blue and the answers are pink. Pick up a question from one pile and try and find the answer in the answer pile. Continue this method to finish the game. If you're playing it with more than one person, take alternate goes to match the cards.
2. Shuffle the cards and face each card down on the table so you cannot see the words on the card. Then lift one card over and read the question, pick another card and see if those two cards match. If they do not turn each card over so you cannot see the words. If they do match, make a pair and put it to the side. Repeat this process until you match all the cards together. If you're playing it with more than one person, take one go each to match the cards. It is also a memory game!
3. If you're really brave, hide the answers and see if you can answer the questions without them! See how many you get right and re-do the questions you got wrong.
4. There are many ways to play this game, see if you can come up with a few ideas yourself!

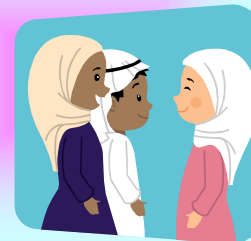
